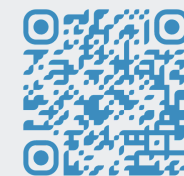

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KYLE

I am not sure about you but I do enjoy watching a parade. Especially a parade where people throw candy like during Easter or St. Patrick's day. I worked at a small country church before being at Ball Camp and they would spruce up a hay trailer and pull that in the community parade each year. We would all pile in and toss the candy we had out of the trailer for the community as we passed by. For us, parades were a moment where we could laugh, have a good time, enjoy time well spent with good people, and spread joy to our community.

But for the Roman's in their time period, the parade was not meant to bring joy and happiness to all. It was a show of power or might. In empires, past and present, military might would be displayed for all to see so that the people in power could suppress the masses and keep them in fear. This parade was a show of how small the individual was and how small other country's power was in comparison to them. This was a show of power and might against those smaller.

Yet in stark contrast to the Roman parade, Jesus's march, or parade, is for those small people that the Romans are trying to suppress. Jesus's march is for all people and the parade forms because of Jesus's authenticity, humility, and love. His actions, character, and love cause people to gather, shout for joy, lay their belongings down, and wave palm branches. This was the response of the people to the love that Jesus gives. What is the good news of Jesus going to inspire you to do this week?
